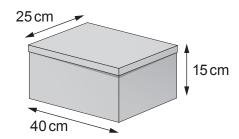

The point where the diagonals of the kite intersect has been marked O on the diagram below.

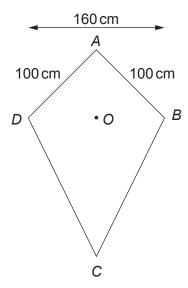

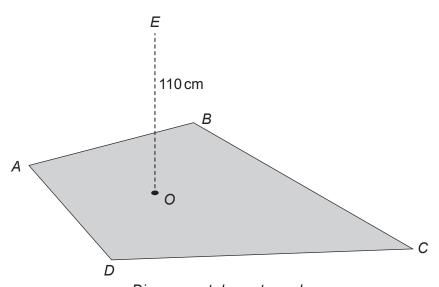

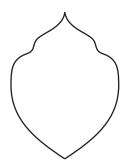

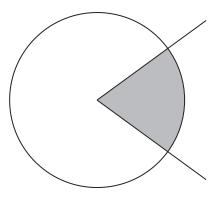
